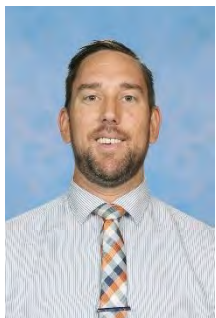

Staff professional development days

Final dates for student attendance

19 November is the final date for Year 12 attendance for receipt of a Senior Statement. 26 November is the final date for student attendance in Years 10 and 11.

Some schools in regional, rural and remote areas will close for the summer holidays on 3 December.

Getting to school

Students at Beautesert State High School come from many different surrounding areas, with multiple bus routes available. Some are dedicated school buses, however the TransLink bus number 540 also stops opposite the school as it travels down Mt Lindesay Hwy between Beautesert and Browns Plains. Parents and carers can call the bus companies direct to enquire about routes, or use the TransLink Journey Planner to find which bus departs from a specific location.

The Journey Planner can be accessed on the TransLink phone app (called MyTransLink) or their website (<https://ip.translink.com.au/plan-your-journey/journey-planner> External link). To use the TransLink Journey Planner, go to the Journey Planner and enter a school day in the date field. Set Arrive Before to 8.50am to find a bus to get to school, or Leave After to 3.10pm to find a bus to get home.

Travelling to school

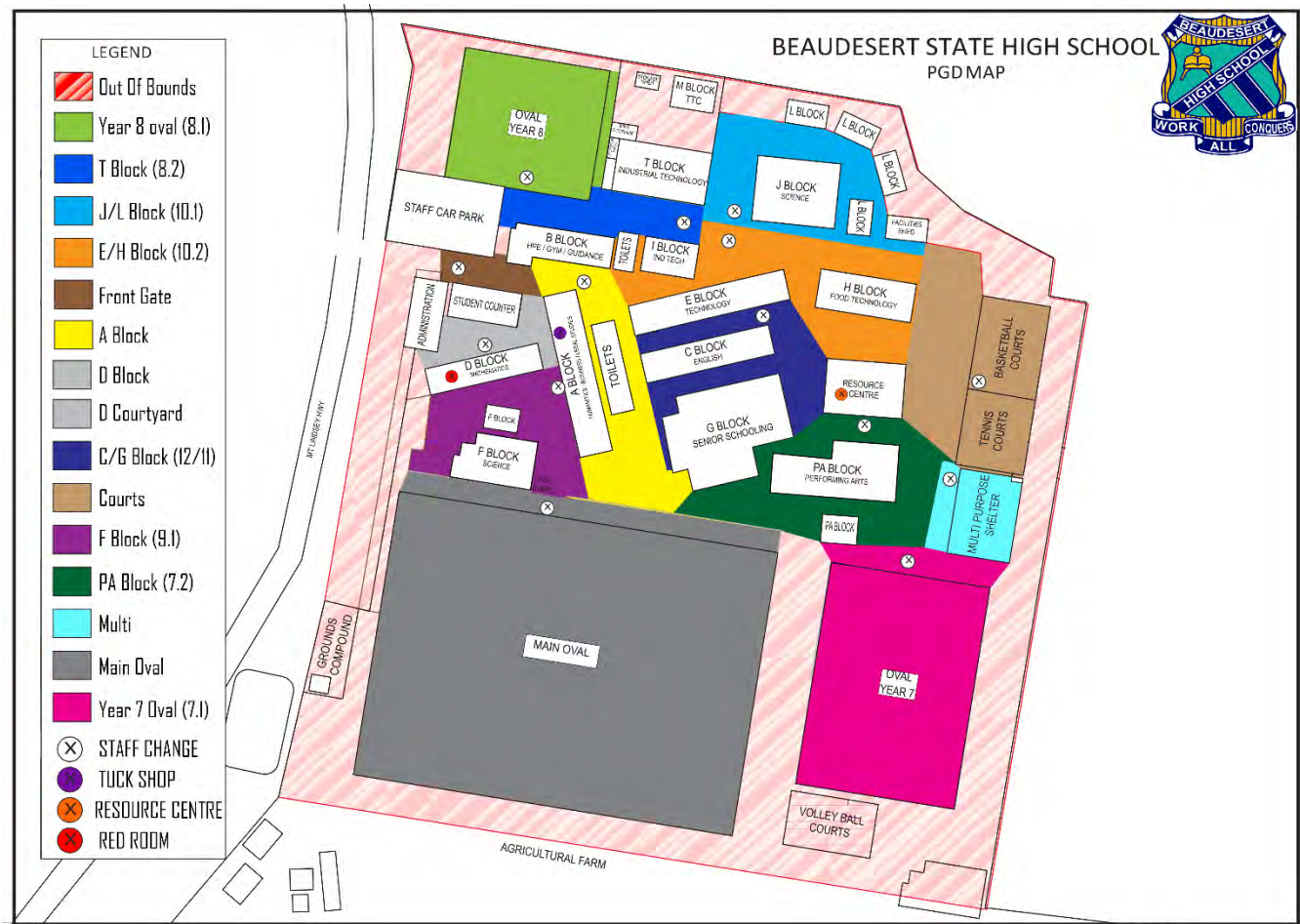

School Arrival and Departure

Before School

Late Arrivals

Beautesert State High School has a process for students that arrive after 9:00 am:

- Students must present to the 'Student Counter' in the 'Administration' building upon arrival
- Parents and carers must provide a valid reason for an absence via 'Compass', emailing 'absences@beautesertshs.eq.edu.au', calling '5542 9111' or providing a physical note
- Students will be provided with an 'Arrival Pass' which must be presented to their classroom teacher

Leaving Early and Signing out

Beautesert State High School has a process for students that depart before 3:00 pm:

- Parents and carers must provide a reason from their departure via 'Compass', emailing 'absences@beautesertshs.eq.edu.au', calling '5542 9111' or a providing physical note
- Students must present to the 'Student Counter' in the 'Administration' building prior to their departure
- Students will be provided with a 'Departure Pass' which must be presented to exit the school grounds

Absences

Beautesert State High School has a process for students that are absent:

- Parents and carers must provide a valid reason for an absence via Compass, emailing absences@beautesertshs.eq.edu.au or calling '5542 9111'
- Parents and carers must respond to the absence text message if they have not previously advised the school of the absence
- Students must present medical documentation for any absences upon their return at the Student Counter in the Administration building
- Parents and carers must respond to the absence text message if they have not previously advised the school of the absence
- Students must present medical documentation for any absences upon their return at the Student Counter in the Administration building

Technology Infringements

Beautesert State High School has a process for students that utilise their mobile phone, smart watch or headphones between 8:50 am to 3:00 pm:

- Students must hand their item of technology to the Student Services Hub
- Students may collect their item of technology after 3:00 pm

Valuables

Beautesert State High School strongly encourages students to refrain from bringing items of value to school.

- Students may keep items stored in the 'Storage Locker' located outside of the 'Student Counter' at the 'Administration' building during the school day.
- Students can only access the 'Storage Locker' before 9:00 am and after 3:00 pm. Items that are lost or stolen should be immediately reported to the 'Student Services Hub' in 'Upper D Block'. Whilst efforts will be made to recover items, Beautesert State High School is not liable for any lost, damaged or stolen items. Beautesert State High School does not hold any insurance to cover the cost of lost, damaged or stolen items.



Taking Medication at School

Medication Beautesert State High School has process for students that require medication during the school day:

- Parents and carers must sign a 'Consent to Administer Medication' form and submit this to the 'Student Counter' in the 'Administration' building to enable the school to administer 'daily' or 'as needed' medications
- Parents and carers must ensure all medications are provided to the 'Student Counter' in the 'Administration' building in the packaging it was dispensed in (e.g. blister pack) clearly labelled by the pharmacy with student details and directions. Parents and carers can liaise with the 'Student Counter' in the 'Administration' building to determine if a medication may be able to be self-administered by the student.

Sick Bay

Beautesert State High School has a process for students that are unwell during the school day.

- Students should present to the 'Student Counter' at the 'Administration' building with their 'Student Planner' signed by their classroom teacher (if the student presents during class time)
- Students are advised the staff of their symptoms and if they wish for a parent or carer to be contacted



Uniform Policy

Beautesert State High School has a school uniform policy that must be enacted during school hours. Students are not permitted to mix Formal Uniform and Sports Uniform items.

Excellence Programs



Academic Academy

Our Academic Excellence program supports high-achieving students with specialist teachers, extended curriculum in all core subjects, and regular feedback. It also offers enrichment opportunities to foster leadership and lifelong learning.

Academic Excellence entry is competitive. For entry into Year 7, students sit the ACER Higher Ability Selection Test, made up of four subtests:

- Abstract Reasoning
- Mathematical Reasoning
- Writing
- Reading Comprehension

Applicants will be short-listed following the results of the HAST test and will be invited to attend a group problem solving activity and a personal interview

Sports Academy

Our school offers a wide range of sporting facilities, including a gym with both cardio equipment and free weights.

Students have the advantage of a comprehensive Health and Physical Education curriculum, with the opportunity of undertaking a Certificate III in Fitness in their Senior years.

Agriculture Academy

Students engaged in this program have the opportunity to experience all things farming. From bee keeping to cattle husbandry.

Students are also encouraged to build their confidence and self-esteem at numerous Show Days throughout the region. Supported by a dedicated and experienced team, students thrive in this program.

Agriculture Leadership Criteria

- Demonstrates competent livestock handling, biosecurity awareness, and ethical animal care.
- Takes initiative with animal welfare duties and consistently meets academic deadlines.
- Builds resilience, responsibility, and teamwork through agricultural challenges and competitions.
- Develops pride, confidence, and a sense of belonging through shared agricultural achievements

Equestrian Academy

The equine-related industries provide exciting and fulfilling careers, whether in breeding, racing or the veterinary fields, and have an exceptionally strong presence in the Scenic Rim.

Course overview:

Students accepted into Beautesert State High School's Equestrian Program will be studying the Equestrian Australia (EA) Equi-Skills Introduction to Horse Management course.

The course covers equine nutrition, anatomy, saddlery, horsemanship and safety and is an industry recognised, stand-alone certificate.

The INHM course does not involve riding. Those who wish to complete the Riding component of the Equi-Skills course may do so, with our fully qualified coach. This occurs every second Week from March until October. The Levy for this is \$300 per year.





Dance Academy

The Academy focuses on developing students' technical and creative skills, through high quality workshops delivered by visiting professional dance companies and by specialist dance teachers.

OUTCOMES for Students:

- increase life skills in self-motivation, discipline and focus
- develop the ability to critically analyse their own work and the work of others.

Contemporary and Jazz Techniques – students examine alignment, floor work, release and strength.

Contemporary, Jazz and Music Theatre Repertoire– students are taught a short piece of choreography from the collective's established repertoire, or repertoire currently in development.

Choreography – students are taught choreographic methods and skills for creating their own contemporary dance works.

Contact/Partnering – students are introduced to contact improvisation and working in pairs. Improvisation – students learn ways to improvise in movement, and to think creatively on the spot.

Dance and Technology – tailored workshops around technology and movement, e.g. film, lighting



Arts Ambassador

The Arts Ambassador is a creative leadership role, awarding of the Arts Ambassador is based on the applicants' ability to meet the ethos of The Arts, acceptance, creativity and individuality.
