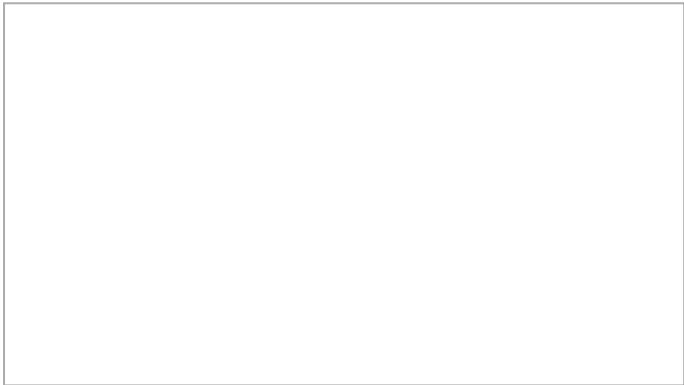
and real-world experiences across agriculture, hospitality, sport, science, the arts and vocational learning programs.
