Winter is coming

As we move into the cooler months, we would like to remind families of Beaudesert State High School's **Winter Uniform Requirements**. Please refer to the image below, which outlines the approved winter uniform items for all students:

Beaudesert State High School students may also choose to wear the following optional items:

- Beanies (navy only)
- Gloves (navy only)
- Scarves (navy only)
- Stockings may be worn with the 'Formal' uniform (black or natural colours)

Students are permitted to wear the following school-branded winter uniform items:

- BSHS Tracksuit Jacket
- BSHS Tracksuit Pants
- BSHS Jumper Pullover

In addition to the core uniform, students may also wear:

- Beanies (navy only)
- Gloves (navy only)
- Scarves (navy only)
- Stockings (black or natural colours) may be worn with the formal uniform.

Please note that all jumpers, pullovers and tracksuit pants **must be official BSHS-branded items**. Non-uniform or unbranded items are not permitted.

Students who arrive at school in incorrect or non-compliant winter uniform items will be directed to **Student Services** to change into the correct uniform for the day.

Wearing the correct uniform is an important part of maintaining high expectations and school pride. It helps build a sense of belonging, equality, and unity across the school community. We appreciate your continued support in ensuring students are dressed appropriately and in accordance with our school's uniform policy.

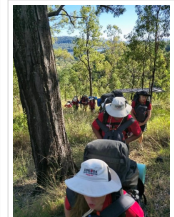

We're incredibly proud of the courage and commitment shown by these students. They are showing us what leadership looks like – one step at a time.

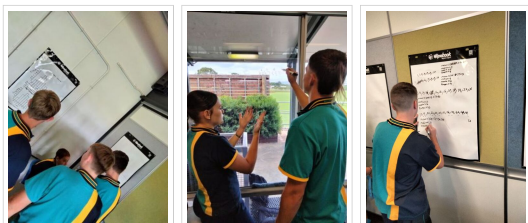
Stay tuned as our Kokoda crew continues their journey, proving every week that they are definitely on the right track!
