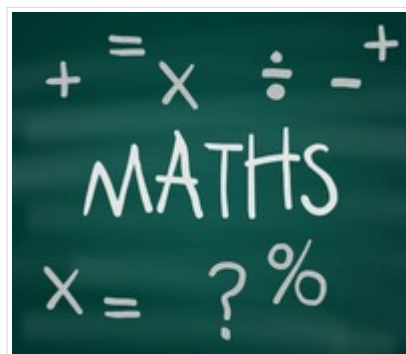
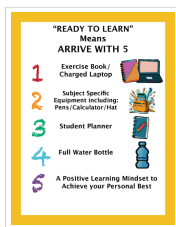
Starting Strong and Giving our Juniors the Edge with "Ready to Learn"

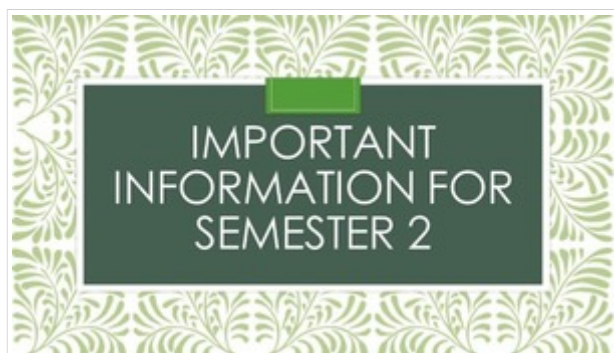


We know that when students feel prepared, they feel engaged, and when they feel engaged, they aim higher. And when they aim higher, there is no limit to their achievement!
